Hargrove William Fox, as Clerk of the said Court on behalf of Joshua
Mize, son of Luemick Mize of the One part; and James Har-
give, of said County of the Other part Witnesseth that the
said Joshua Mize, is honestly and industriously to serve and
Obey the said James Hargrove, in all lawful Commands
until he shall be twenty one years old, and he the said
James Hargrove, doth Covenant and agree to find the
said Joshua Mize a Sufficiency of good Cloathes as also a
Sufficiency of good wholesome Diet, and all other necessaries
so long as he shall serve him, and to learn him the said
Joshua, all the Common Arts and misteries of the farm-
business, and to have him taught to read write, and
Common Arithmetick including the Rules of three, and to
treat him in a humane and tender manner in all things,
and at the expiration of the said Joshua Mize service
the said James Hargrove, is to give him three pounds
ten Shilling, and a decent new suit of Cloathes In Wit-
ness whereof the said James Hargrove, hath hereunto
set his hand and affixed his seal, and the said William
Fox, as Clerk of the said Court hath hereunto set his hand
and affixed his seal this 25th day of June 1855

in all lawful Commands for the Term of four years in
all things, as well as relative to the said Carpenters trade
&c. which the said Bunge obliges himself to use his endeavor
- in to learn them all the Arts and misteries of said trade,
and to treat them the said Zachariah & Anthony in a human
- and, and tender manner, during the Term aforesaid, and to
give them three months schooling, furnish them a sufficiency
of good strong cloaths, and at the expiration of the said Zachariah
& Anthony's service the said Bunge, agrees
to give them a sack plain Smoothing plain face plain
and hand saw each the said Boys now in the possession
