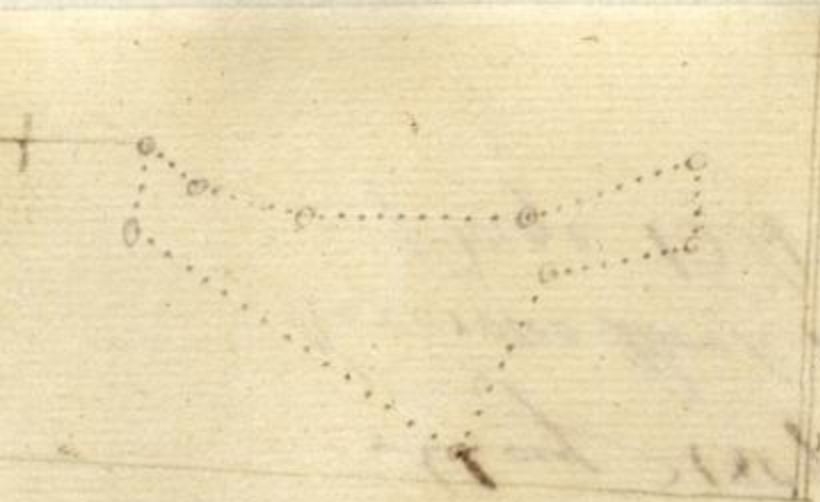

in consideration of a Kentucky Land office warrant
Number one hundred and Sixty one there is granted
by the said commonwealth unto John Collier
assignee of Thomas Bryant who was assignee of
Charles Dotson a certain tract or parcel of
land containing Fifty acres by survey bearing
date the seventh day of June one thousand eight
hundred and eight lying and being in the county
of Pulaski on the water of Cumberland river
and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning
on a ~~white oak~~ ^{walnut} and Sugar tree thence running
North thirty eight East twenty two poles to a
beech and dogwood thence North fifteen East
forty poles to three dogwoods and white oak thence
North seventy eight poles to a white oak and
gum thence North Nineteen West ninety two
poles to a white oak and beech thence East
thirty poles to a white oak thence South Eleven
East fifty four poles to two poplars thence
South Sixty four East seventy poles to a sta
