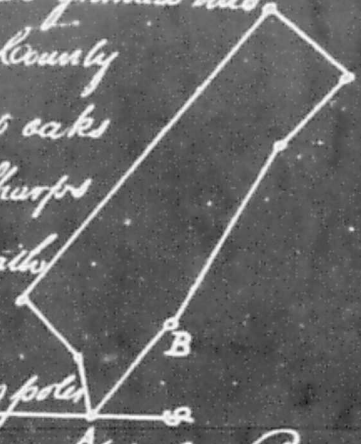
Stoner, or evidently his estate, does not make final payment for remaining 25 acres of 150 warrant. Here, payment is made evidently by estate for 15 of the remaining 25 acres so total grant totals 140 acres out of 150 warrant.
