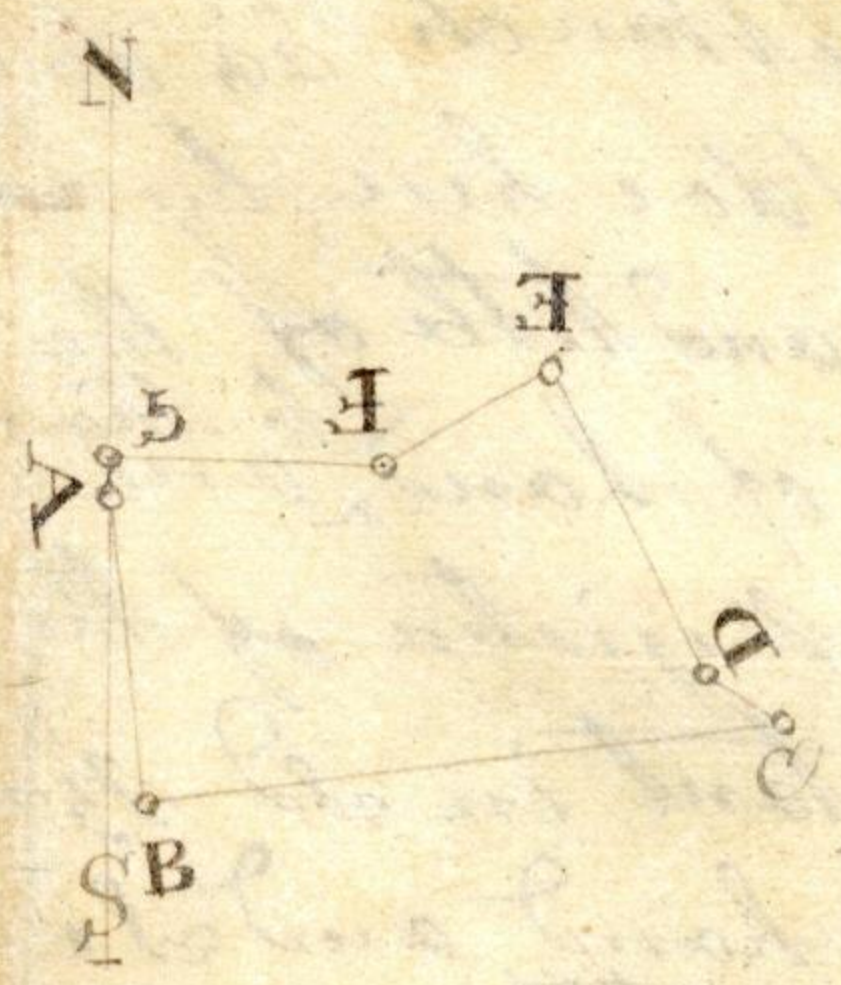

twenty eighth day of August one thousand eight hundred and seventeen
lying and being in the County of Pulaski on Brush Creek the waters of
Buck Creek and bounded as followeth To wit " Beginning at a white

East seventy poles to a chestnut and two sourwoods thence North eighty
three East one hundred and forty four poles to a white walnut and spanish
oak on Charles Lees line North fifty eight West twenty poles to two hickories

West seventy six poles to a white oak and dogwood in his line thence
South fifty nine West forty four poles to a black oak bush on a cleft of
