to <sup>3</sup> Blk Bolger of the one part and Lindsey Bolger of the other  
both inhabitants of Calcasieu County, Kentucky, Tennessee that  
the said James P. Bolger for and in consideration of the  
sum of two hundred and eighty eight Dollars to him  
in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged,  
w<sup>e</sup>lledged, he has this day bargained sold conveyed  
and confirmed and doth hereby convey & confirm  
unto said Lindsey Bolger all his right title in trust  
and claim in  $\frac{1}{3}$  to the estate of his deceased father  
John Bolger both real and personal estates, excepting  
and reserving his interest in the Black place heretofore sold  
also excepting and reserving his interest in the negro woman  
Amanda and her child Sarah heretofore conveyed to  
said Lindsey by a bill of sale the said Lindsey  
Bolger to have and to hold all said in trust with  
reservations aforesaid to himself and his heirs  
forever and the said James P. Bolger agrees to  
warrant and forever defend the title to said  
interest against the claims or claimants of himself  
& heirs and all other claims whatsoever.
