

Findings of Court on application for Confederate Pension.

The application of Susan Colyer, was this day presented to the Court, and it appearing to the Court that the same had been duly and regularly filed to-wit: on May, 14, 1912., and the Court after hearing the evidence and being advised returned the following findings to-wit:

The applicant is old, infirm and incapable of earning support by manual labor; that she has property both real and personal to the value of four to six hundred dollars; that she has been a citizen of this County all her life; and that the witnesses to the application are entitled to full credit and faith; in support to the above findings the following witnesses were produced before the Court.

The witness William Colyer stated that the applicant has been a citizen of this County all her life; and is old, infirm and incapable of laboring for her support; and has property both real and personal in the value of five or six hundred dollars;

Also the witness James L.Colyer, stated that the applicant has been a citizen of this County all her life; and that she is old infirm and uncapable of labor; and has property both real and personal to the value of five or six hundred dollars.
