

GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of part of a warrant from the Pulaski County Court, there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto Bluford Colyer

a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing one hundred Acres, by survey, bearing date the 30th day of December one thousand eight hundred and forty four lying and being in the County of Pulaski on the waters of Cumberland river and bounded as follows to wit Beginning at a sycamore and hickory in the Runcheon hollow a corner of his old Survey thence his line south $52^{\circ} W$ 40 poles to a bunch of sunwoods his corner his line $57^{\circ} W$ 60 poles to a gum where once stood a Spanish oak his corner thence his line $53^{\circ} E$ 80 poles to a white oak his corner his line $31^{\circ} E$ 78 poles to a stake thence $N 80^{\circ} W$ 34 poles to a beech and gum thence $E 22^{\circ} W$ 18 poles to two white oaks thence $S 65^{\circ} W$ 10 poles to two chestnut oaks thence $N 35^{\circ} W$ 60 poles to a hickory thence $E 25^{\circ} E$ 34 poles to two poplars thence $E 65^{\circ} N$ 60 poles to a white oak and black oak thence $E 25^{\circ} E$ 60 poles to a chestnut oak thence $N 41^{\circ} W$ 60 poles to two Spanish oaks thence $E 60^{\circ} E$ 84 poles to a white oak thence $S 30^{\circ} E$ 90 poles to a poplar thence $S 32^{\circ} W$ 24 poles to a black oak and poplar thence due West 30 poles to a beech and dogwood thence $E 21^{\circ} W$ 180 poles to the Beginning.
