This deed made this 17th day of Sept 1866, by and between
George Hail Sheriff of Pulaski County of the one part, and
Andrew Warren of said County and State of Kentucky of the
second part. Witnesseth, That Whereas on the 11th day of May
1849, an execution of Jura issued from the Clerks office of the Pulaski Circuit
Court in favor of Elisha P. Bragg and against the estate of Bedford Colyer
for the sum of \$222²⁵ with interest thereon after the rate of six per
Centum per annum from the 13th day of February 1848, until paid 476.54
Cents, which said execution was afterwards, to wit, levied on the 12th day
of May 1849, placed in the hands of S. Newell, D. S. for S. Gaggins S. P. C., and
returned with a credit thereon of \$100. paid 13th Feb 1848 as per endorse-
ment on judgement rendered herein 20th Decr 18- Another
execution issued on Replein Bond against Bedford Colyer Jas. M.
Leman, W. Colyer, and W. (alias) William Pratic and in favor
of aforesaid Elisha P. Bragg for \$146.65 Cents interest and costs
which said execution was staid by order of the Plaintiff,
Jan 22nd 1850, and whereas on the 28th day of Oct 1851, an
other execution issued and was returned with Credits thereon
said execution having been partially satisfied, and whereas
on the 5th day of August 1851, another execution issued from
the Clerks office aforesaid against the estate of Bedford Colyer
Jas. M. Leman et. al in favor of E. P. Bragg for the sum of \$146
65 Cents with interest thereon from the 16th day of July 1849 until
paid also 91 Cents, Cents, which said execution was afterwards
to wit, on the 15th Sept 1851 placed in the hands of W. A. Mills, D. S.
for J. Barber Sheriff of Pulaski County, to levy make & satisfy, which
said execution was levied on the interest of Bedford Colyer which
descended to him from John Colyer deceased in 300 acres of land
on Pelmon Creek, The Home place I died on the 15th day of Sept 1851
it being County Court day - offer said B. Colyer's interest in aforesaid
300 acres of land for sale at the Court house door in the town
of Somerset, when E. P. Bragg being the highest and best bidder

became the purchaser of the interest in the 300 acres of land, for the sum of \$25⁰⁰. Also said E P Gregg became the purchaser of 1 Buford Leathers' interest in 100 acres which was sold at same time & place for the sum of \$10⁰⁰.

The said Elisha P Gregg having by written agreement transferred the benefit of the purchase of the interest in the aforesaid 300 acres to Andrew Warren now for and in consideration of the sale purchase and transfer of the interest in the 300 acres aforesaid. I George Hail Sheriff as aforesaid do hereby convey unto the said Andrew Warren his heirs all the right title interest and claim in and to the 300 acres, interest so purchased by E P Gregg. The interest hereby conveyed, is in the 300 acres (same place) only.

To Have and to hold unto the said Andrew Warren his heirs and assigns forever, In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand as Sheriff of Pulaski County, this 7th day of Sept. 1866.

Ky.

For the consideration of Six hundred dollars in hand paid, & bounded as followeth, to wit, beginning at a rock on the back line and corner to Sec 10 at 11 on Hall and running with the same S 57 1/2 E 65 poles & 9 links to a rock in said road and corner - the second lot at 4. Thence with the road S 27 E 67 1/4 poles to a rock in said road at the Creek at 5. Thence up the Creek due West 69 poles to a rock on the back line at 10.

Thence with the back line S 33 1/2 W 32 poles & 14 links to the Beginning, All warrant and forever defend the title of ourselves and heirs, to the said D F Bash & his heirs.
