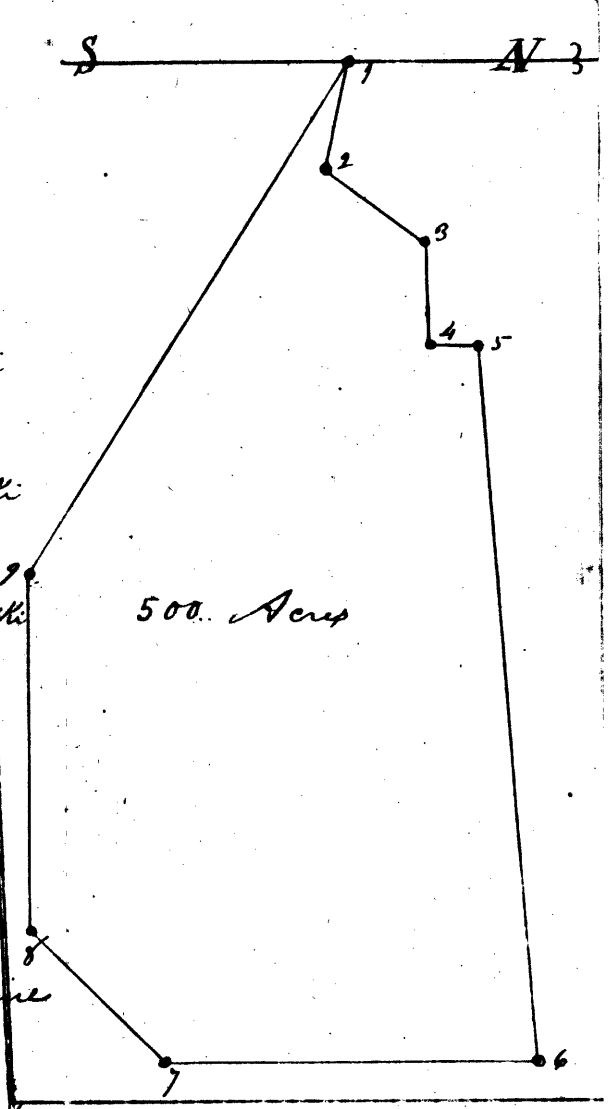

KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of a *wt from the Pulaski*  
County Court, there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto *Lindsay Colyer and John*  
*Lair the said Lair being a part of said Colyer for and half*

a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing *five hundred* Acres, by  
survey, bearing date the *2<sup>d</sup>* day of *September* one thousand eight hundred  
and *forty five* lying and being in the County of *Pulaski on the waters of*

*Cumberland river and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning*  
*at two spruce pines at the head of the Little Lick branch*  
*standing under a large shelving rock running thence*  
*S 75 E 55 poles to a pine thence N 35 E 68 poles to a hickory*  
*thence due E 54 poles to a spruce pine and mountain bush*  
*thence due N 26 poles to a spruce pine on the big Lick*  
*branch thence down said branch binding thence N 85*  
*E 300 poles to a stake thence S 45 W 100 poles to a stake thence*  
*due West 190 poles to a stake thence N 57 W 320 poles to the*  
*Beginning*
