Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting: KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of a Certificate No 65 granted by the State of Kentucky for the Relief of Settlers on the South Side of Green River agreeable to an Act of Assembly passed in the Year One thousand Seven hundred and ninety eight there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto Michael Stone

a certain Tract or Parcel of Land, containing Two hundred acres by Survey bearing date the Twenty fourth day of July eighteen hundred lying and being in the County of Pulaski on the north side of Cumberland River and bounded as follows To wit Beginning at Two white Oaks near Sharps corner thence running north sixty two degrees West eighty poles to a stake on Joseph Bonds line about four poles below the improvement thence with said Bonds line South eighty degrees West Two hundred poles passing said Bonds corner to a black Oak and White Oak thence South Twenty degrees East eighty seven poles to two White Oaks thence South sixty two degrees East One hundred and twenty nine poles to a post Oak near Sharps line thence North Twenty two degrees East One hundred and twenty nine poles to the Beginning

With its appurtenances: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract or Parcel of Land, with its appurtenances, to the said
