Whereas, in the action of D. D. Early against Alex^r? Defendant, then pending in the Pulaski Circuit Court, an Order was entered at the Sept Term 1867, directing Eben Miller the Master Commissioner of said Court to expose for sale at public auction the property herein after described. And whereas said property was sold in accordance with said order, on the 25th day of July 1868, and for the sum of thirty nine dollars, And Whereas the Report of said sale was confirmed by said Court, at the Sept Term 1868, and at the March Term 1873, an Order was entered directing the Commissioner to execute a deed of conveyance of said property to said James Sears. Now therefore, this Indenture made and entered this 29th day of March 1873 between D. D. Early by Eben Miller Master Commissioner of the said Court, of the first part, and James Sears of the second part witnesseth that for and in consideration of the premises, and for the further consideration of the full payment of the purchase price aforesaid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the parties of the first part, by Eben Miller as Commissioner aforesaid, have sold and by this writing does convey to said party of the second part and his heirs and assigns forever, the following described property, to wit, A tract of one half acre of land on Pitman Creek embracing the Mill of Alexander Hollis, and bounded as follows, Beginning at a rock above the abutment opposite the mill house running thence down the creek and with the cliff 8783 poles to an elm below the abutment at the cliff then crossing the creek 183.812 poles to a rock near a peach tree marked as point N 16^{1/2} W 14 poles to a beech tree on the bank of the creek, then with the creek 856 1/2 W 5 poles and 6 links to a lycamens, then due south 8 poles to a stake thence crossing the creek above the abutment 874.005 poles to the beginning to stone and to holes the said property, together with the rights and privileges and appurtenances thereto belonging unto the party of the second part and his heirs and assigns forever.
