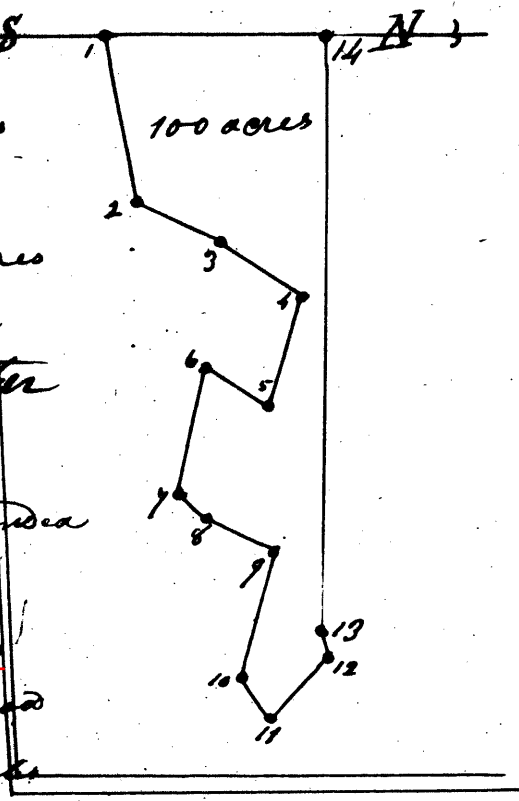


Surveyed for Bluford Colyer the 30th day of ~~October~~ ^{December} 1844 one hundred acres of Land by virtue of a part of a pulaski County Court Land warrant of 200 acres N^o 284. which issued from the pulaski County Court Clarks office the 27th October 1844 Situate in pulaski County in the waters of Cumberland River and bounded as follows To wit Beginning at a white oak and dogwood East of said Colyer House thence N 80 East 92 poles to a dogwood and Black oak, thence N 26 East 50 poles



To a poplar and gum John Colyer's corner thence his line N 32 East 52 poles to a dogwood and chestnut his corner, thence his line S 75 East 63 poles to a chestnut oak his corner, his line S 34 West 40 poles to a dogwood and chestnut thence S 78 East 70 poles to a black oak and gum thence N 45 East 20 poles to a white oak, thence N 24 East 40 poles to a dogwood thence S 75 East 70 poles to a chestnut oak thence N 57 East 26 poles to a chestnut oak, thence N 45 West 46 poles to a chestnut oak thence S 73 West 14 poles to a chestnut oak thence Due west 915 poles to a Stake thence due South 118 poles To the Beginning

GOVERNOR OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That by virtue and in consideration of part of a warrant from the Pulaski County Court, there is granted by the said Commonwealth, unto Bluford Colyer

a certain tract or parcel of Land, containing *one hundred* Acres, by
survey, bearing date the *3rd* day of *December* one thousand eight hundred
and *forty four* lying and being in the County of *Pulaski* on the
waters of *Cumberland* river and bounded as followeth to wit
Beginning at a white oak and dogwood East of said Colyer's
house thence *N 40° E 92 poles* to a dogwood and black oak thence
N 26° E 50 poles to a poplar and gum John Colyer corner his line
N 32° E 52 poles to a dogwood and chestnut tree his corner his
line *S 71° E 63 poles* to a chestnut oak his corner his line *S 34° West*
40 poles to a dogwood and chestnut thence *S 78° E 70 poles* to a
black oak and gum thence *N 45° E 20 poles* to a white oak
thence *N 24° E 40 poles* to a dogwood thence *S 75° E 70 poles* to a
chestnut oak thence *N 51° E 26 poles* to a chestnut oak thence *N 45°*
W 46 poles to a chestnut oak thence *S 75° W 14 poles* to a chestnut
