Madam:

I have to advise you that from the papers in the pension claim W. 8634 it appears that John Colyer while residing in Virginia served as a soldier of the Virginia Line, War of the Revolution, dates of service and names of officers not stated.

He also served as a Sergeant in Captain Jacob Tipton's Company, Colonel William Darke's First Regiment of U. S. Levies, in 1791 in General St. Clair's army, was at the battle of St. Clair's Defeat, and he was allowed pension from September 4, 1791 on account of disability incurred in this service, the nature of which is not stated.

In 1821 he was living in Lincoln County, Kentucky and he died in Rookcastle County, Kentucky March 31, 1826.

He married in Virginia in 1772 or 1773, Grizzy
